Did you Know.....

By Joey Wagner—Theater training improves cognitive skills. For four weeks, 122 older adults took acting lessons featuring exercises that required cognitive, affective and physical skills. Compared to people in groups that participated in singing or in no activities, those who exprienced the acting lessons significantly improved in tests of word recall, prose comprehension/recall, word generation and problem-solving.

WARMUPS

Why do a warm up?

Actors are similar to athletes. Performing in a play (whether a musical or straight play) can be very demanding on the body and voice. It's important to warm up before rehearsals and performances. Warm ups also help with concentration and focus. When done with the full cast, it can also become a consistent "ritual" that will help bring the cast together as a team.

Breathing

Focus on deep central breathing (vs. clavicular, aka "shallow" or "shoulder" breathing.) Imagine you have a tire around your waist that is partially deflated. Inhale, filling the tire with air. Exhale and the tire releases some of that air. If you don't feel your abdominal muscles moving on the inhale, sit in a chair and hold onto the bottom of the seat. Try the exercise again. (By holding onto the chair you are limiting your ability to move your shoulders on the inhale.)

Gentle physicals

Neck "rolls"
Shoulder rolls
Stretches (try yawning – add a vocal to the yawn – while stretching.)
"Smiley face" yawn (show your teeth) – will stretch the soft palate

Vocals

Massage the face and the area under your chin Push / pull exercise with lips (pucker, smile, pucker, smile, etc.)

Exercise to stretch the Articulators:

$$Too-tee$$
 Bee-boo-tee-too Wee-way

$$Mro - mro$$
 $Taw - taw$ $Goo - gaw$

Articulation drills

A proper cup of coffee in a proper copper coffee cup.

Relaxation, Concentration, Focusing

Relaxation: stretch intensely and yawn / sigh deeply rather than finishing the yawn

Mental alertness: object scramble exercise

This was the exercise where you point to an object and call it anything except what it is. Do this quickly and without editing yourself for one minute.

Concentration / calming: "hang ten" alternate breathing

Close your RIGHT nostril. Inhale deeply through the LEFT nostril. Close the LEFT nostril and open the RIGHT and exhale through the RIGHT. Inhale through the RIGHT. Close the RIGHT. Exhale through the LEFT. Inhale through the LEFT. Exhale through the RIGHT. (and so on...)

Minutes of the General Membership Meeting - March 26, 2009
