- The Patriotic group is scheduled for the Caton Merchant Center during October.
- Rest Room Update—Arlene Maroney and Everett Medlin reviewed the plan and found that it would cost approximately three times the original projection. We can consider using black drapes to shield a way for the actors to get on and off stage. Pat Dews will check on the drapes.
- Use of the Billiard Room—On September 6th, M.J. submitted a written proposal to the Facilities and Grounds Committee to use the Billiards Room for one week only in November 2008. The biggest objection is moving any of the billiard tables. The First P of Voice: Pitch

Have you ever been to a lecture where the speaker never varies his pitch? You will find it boring and probably tune it out unless you make a great effort to concentrate. What you need to do is create "word pictures" and one of the ways is by using your voice's ability to change in pitch.

Most of us speak naturally in the middle range, which is pleasing unless it is used without variation or inflection. We all change the pitch of our voices to indicate various emotions: anger, love, surprise, authority, happiness, guile, nervousness, hatred, serenity, anxiety, rudeness, sexuality, enthusiasm, moodiness, confidence, etc. We can also change our tone by going "nasal" or "breathy" or "throaty." Can you think of other ways to change your voice pitch or tone?

Some exercises to consider: 1)Read aloud every day for at least 15 minutes. Read articles from the newspaper, a magazine or even the back of the cereal box: 2)Take time to occasionally record your readings: 3)Listen to the recording later and take notes on how you can improve: 4)Occasionally try to imitate the voices you hear while watching TV or listening to the radio.
