Treasurer Treva Whyte reported a balance of \$9744.60. We had expenses from the production, cast party and refreshments from last meeting.

Joyce Mancini suggested that the coffee and refreshments for the monthly meeting be discontinued due to the annual expense. This matter to be taken up later under New Business.

Betty Hitchcock announced that we will have a buffet dinner in the clubhouse board room on August 9th. (5PM) A list was passed around to sign up. Our clubhouse accounts will be used as form of payment. Cancellation will be by the standard procedure of the red clubhouse form. Betty also asked for a volunteer to host the annual picnic in Sept or Oct.

Membership chair Ed Prendergast said it's been a slow couple of months. Ed then reported on the prices of the 3 storage facilities that he contacted. Joyce Mancini reacted to annual amount as too costly for the organization. Gene asked for a volunteer to offer their basement for storage. Betty suggested that a resident be encouraged to provide storage space in their home for a small stipend. Joey Wagner suggested that much of the pieces be discarded; it would be more economical to replace them than to pay to store them. Kathryn Schmiel made a motion to put an ad in the Horn asking for storage space within the community. Motion was approved.

Gene commended Roger del Rosario on the playwriting contest.

Goldie Grandy reported that she took action that caused the HHLT meeting to appear on the calendar in the Horn.

Gene thanked Helen Esposito and Bill Harrison for their work on the newsletter for the last 3 years. Bets is due to take over this responsibility. He also reminded members that there would be a read thru of act 1 of "A Few Good Years". (AFGY)

Lois Potter asked for photos from Arsenic and Old Lace. It is the only production undocumented in the scrapbook.

NEW BUSINESS: Joyce Mancini made a motion that \$125 was too much to pay for refreshments for so few members attending the monthly meeting. The motion was to stop the refreshments. During discussion Lois suggested reducing the amount ordered and limiting refreshments to 4 times a year. This issue will be discussed at the next board meeting..

The meeting was adjourned at 7:40 PM. Next meeting will be August 18, 2011.
