Long time HHLT members remember a cold winter evening in 2003 when 41 Heritage Hunt residents gathered at the invitation of Bets Knepley to discuss the possibility of forming a little theater. That meeting under the leadership of Bets resulted in 28 residents joining together to form a vibrant, dynamic organization which has contributed invaluably to the Heritage Hunt community. Bets' contribution to HHLT. She was the first president and served several terms. She was director of numerous early productions, including musicals "Don't Say No to the USO" (2003), "Westward Whoa" (June 2004), "Charleston" (November 2004), "When in Rome" (Spring 2006), and "Cemetery Club" (Spring 2007), "Love Letters" (February 2008), and "Old Time Radio" (May 2008). Besides directing, Bets was coordinator of acting and directing workshops, and served as newsletter editor and website publisher. In recent years she and her very talented photographer husband Ed have created the beautiful programs and publicity posters that have graced our productions. Now as they plan their move to Pennsylvania it is impossible to say how much their time and talents will be missed. We want to express to them our heartfelt appreciation and gratitude and send our best wishes as they raise the curtain on "another opening, another show!"

It is our pleasure to announce that we will be co-directing "Social Secu-rity" as the fall 2015 HHLT production on October 6, 7, and 8. This 1986 comedy was directed by Mike Nichols and starred Marlo Thomas, Olympia Dukakis, Joanna Gleason, and Ron Silver, and ran on Broadway for a year. The New York Post wrote, "Just when you were beginning to think you were never going to laugh on Broadway again, along comes Social Security. . . The play is a hoot, and better yet, a sophisticated, civilized hoot." We know you will agree.

We will be doing a read-through of parts of the play after the Thursday, May 21 HHLT meeting, at which time we will have copies of the script for potential actors to review and audition application forms.

There are six characters in the play, three male and three female. Ages range from mid 40s to a 98 year old male. General Meeting April 16, 2015

The meeting was called to order in the Craft Room at 7:00 PM by President Denny Cumber.

Thirty members were present, including all Board members as well as the Director of Communications.

Secretary's Report: Jim Burwell read aloud the minutes of the March General Meeting. In a minor correction of the At-Large Report, "HHLT Grounds Committee" was changed to "HH Grounds Committee". The minutes were then approved as written.

Treasurer's Report: Helen Esposito noted Income of \$20 and Expenses of \$325.55 during this reporting period. The balance as of April 7, 2015 is \$8,823.65. The Report was accepted.

Vice-President's Report: Sandy Thompson reported that a Director is being sought for the Fall Play. Provisional production dates are October 6th, 7th, and 8th.

President's Report: Denny announced that a meeting regarding "Show of Interest" for the October Variety Show (being sponsored by the HH Women's Organization) will be held in the Mountain View Room on June 17th at 7 PM.

Activities Report: Georgiana Ide encouraged members to send expressions of appreciation to Bets Knepley before her departure this Summer. The Annual Picnic will take place the afternoon of October 17th at Georgiana's home on Culverhouse Court. (Rain date, October 18th.) Suggestions and help with planning would be appreciated. Discussion was held regarding other possible group activities. Members meeting for Dinner followed by attendance at a Theater performance was mentioned. Also suggested was a road trip, possibly to Staunton, Virginia, home of the American Shakespeare Center's Blackfriars Playhouse.

Membership Report: Ginny McCardle reported that members who are delinquent in paying their dues are being contacted. The Brochure regarding HHLT Membership has been updated and will be distributed at performances of the Spring Play.

At-Large Report: Kathy Carrico has received approval for a new Memorial Bench at the same location, possibly to be placed on a "paved grid". An update of the plan and possible alternatives will be submitted at a later date.

Communications Report: Kathryn Schmiel reported that Joyce Mancini has volunteered to assist her in some of the duties of the Communications Director. She is seeking to recruit at least one other HHLT member, possibly to manage our Web site.

Old Business: Denny reported that the new Donations Policy Guidelines should be ready for presentation next month. Bylaws review will be completed in the near future.

April 26th in the Ballroom. Denny encouraged members to invite friends and neighbors to the Play.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:30 PM.
