Heritage Hunt Little Theater General Meeting 01/17/19

President Gene Schmiel called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM. Approximately 25 members were present.

President's Report: Gene welcomed everyone to the meeting and thanked the previous board. Dues are due for the year -- \$10.00 for individual or family. He said rehearsals for "Trip to Bountiful" have begun. Dates for the spring play will be April 9th at 7pm. April 10th at 2pm matinee, and April 11th at 7pm. He announced that HHLT member Tina Mullins had recently won a "best actress" award for her lead role in "Hello Dolly." winning achievement. He also announced that there were sign-up sheets for members to use to volunteer to help in various HHLT activities.

Vice-President's Report: Ginny McCardle shared that she has potential ideas for a Fall Play. Ina Mayer spoke about needing people to help with the TTT (Traveling Theater Troop). Ina mentioned there are 5 programs and no memorization was needed as the scripts could be used. Ginny noted the sign-up sheet for play-reading and encouraged members to read plays to assess their suitability for HHLT performances.

Secretary's Report: Paula James explained her duties as secretary and also spoke about her participation as an actress in upcoming performances of "Phantom of the Opera" with Oregon Ridge Dinner Theater and Baltimore Actors Theater. HHLT will likely make a trip to attend the play as one of the activities for the year.

Treasurer's Report: Kathy Carrico was not present. Gene read her report that the ending balance for 12/31/18 is \$6454.73. In response to a member's question, Gene said that the fall play, "Odd Couple," made a small profit.

Membership Report: Tina Mullins reported that

she has one new member, Karen Siegall, and one one potential member – Gordon Chapin, both of whom attended this meeting. Tina spoke about the sticker name badges as opposed to current badges to keep it simple. Tina noted that in Kathy's absence, she was collecting the dues for the year. She added that there was a sign in sheet to assist with ideas for getting new members. (Gordon joined HHLT at the end of the meeting).

Activities Report: Andy Mays is planning the 16th year Birthday/Anniversary party for the General meeting date of 02/21/19. She noted the sign-up sheets for joining the activities committee and discussed the potential bus trip to see "Phantom of the Opera." Andy spoke about getting volunteers to deliver the donations to SOWW which were collected at the holiday party. She also noted that there was a sign-up sheet for those who wished to entertain at the birthday party.

Communications Report: Kathryn stated there is a sign-up sheet for a One Act play reading group. She mentioned the sign- up sheets again for the scholarship and play writing contest, as well as for taking tickets and greeting people for the spring play. Ina suggested that Kathryn email members who were not present asking them also to volunteer for the actions noted on the sign-up sheets. Nick Ide told the group that the DVDs will be available next week for the "Odd Couple" for those that ordered copies.

At-Large Report: Marian has received 2 submissions for the play writing contest – the poster in the lobby is now updated with the new deadline of 01/31/19 for the contest. The winner for the student scholarship will be chosen in April 2019, and Marian asked for volunteers to consider the applications from the students.


Old Business: Gene announced that HHLT will be buying Pipes and Drapes for use in the
