### **LSTV Reports**



John Bisaga, longtime member of LSTV and talented sound and light tech who has worked all of our plays, visited our May meeting to discuss the needs of LSTV. He pointed out that the recent play demanded of the LSTV more technical support that past plays due to complicated lighting moves and carefully-timed sound effects. John pointed out that many hours were invested in the technical aspects of the play. Among the tasks LSTV undertakes are studying and marking the scripts for sound and lighting cues, researching appropriate sound effects on the internet, assigning and marking microphones for actors, consulting with directors for their input on lighting and sound, and video production and editing. John emphasized the need for more volunteers especially from the HHLT membership. He expressed the hope that one day HHLT will be able to handle the technical as well as the dramatic aspects of play production.

Another issue he brought up was the limited use of the hearing assist capability. Only two audience members made use of the technology for *The Trip to Bountiful*. John suggested that



more intense advertising would improve the rate of usage. The amplifiers make attending a play much more rewarding for audience members who are hearing impaired.
