

Our Drama After Dark activity for the March 24th meeting is one of the longest running and most popular of the genre Gunsmoke. Gunsmoke starring James Arness ran for 20 years (1955 to 1975). on CBS-TV. Before that it aired 480 episodes on CBS-Radio from 1952 to 1961 starring William Conrad. The episode we will present on March 24, "Blood on His Hands," is from the radio series.





# The Oscars



Coming up in March, as well as March Madness and St, Patrick's Day, are the Academy Awards, commonly known as the Oscars. While movies, cinema, picture shows, and motion pictures as they are variously called are over 100 years old, the first Academy Awards ceremony was held in 1929 at the Hollywood Roosevelt Hotel with 270 in attendance. Emil Jannings and Janet Gaynor won the Best Actor and Best Actress awards. The entire program was only 27

minutes in length. The ceremony is sponsored by the Academy of Motion Pictures Arts and Sciences. Over the

years the number of competitive categories have increased with 24 currently as well as honorary awards.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:20 pm.




