After a career in public education and church administration and finance, Dot and her husband Bill moved to Heritage Hunt in 2004. She soon became involved in HHLT where she found a great place to use her theatrical talents. Dot appeared in numerous plays in over 15 years in Little Theater.

To name a few, Dot was in *Murder at the Orient Express*, *Old Hams*, *Trip to Bountiful*, *Checkers*, *Larceny and Old Lace*, *Old Time Radio*, *Love Letters*, *Reunion at Mt. Sanguine*. She directed *A Bad Year for Tomatoes* and appeared in *Arsenic and Old Lace* at the Hylton Center. She loved to sing and was a member of two choral groups, The Celebration Singers and Women of Note. She also liked sew, do counted cross-stitch, knit, and crochet.

Dot had a son Bill and daughter Janet, four grandchildren, 4 great grandchildren, and many step-grandchildren and I step-great grandson.

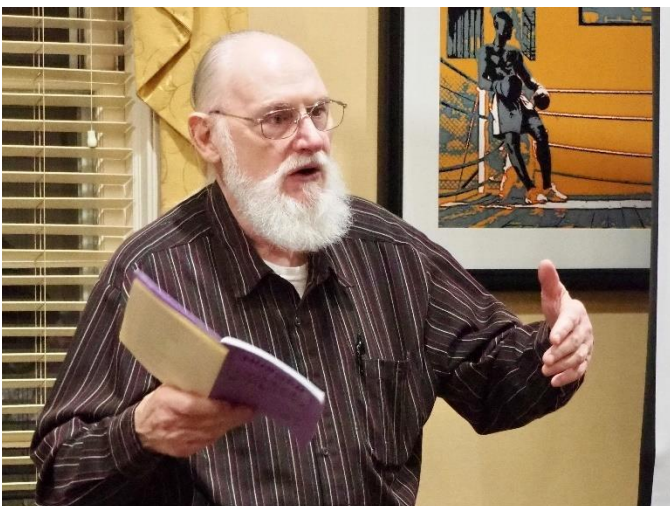

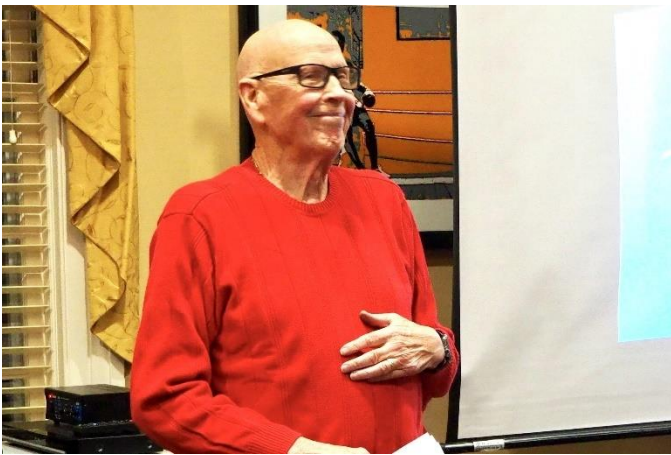
