PR-18: Working with HOA and Food and Beverage Committee

Gene Schmiel and Andy Mays have been trying to get on paper that HHLT will not have to pay for a bar to guarantee use of the ballroom on play dates. Andy attended the last Food and Beverage Committee meeting to back the passing of PR–18, which says a bar is not needed to secure dates for use of ballroom. Under the proposed PR-18, groups, like HHLT can schedule and have an event without being moved due to a paid event. Specifically, the language is: "A resident event may not be relocated Sunday through Thursday for an outside contracted event. In the case of a significant event, an appeal will be discussed with the chair of the Food and Beverage Committee in collaboration with the Board of Directors." This is an important decision that will benefit many chartered Heritage Hunt groups.


Local Talent!







