HHLT Board Meeting Minutes—October 14, 2025

The meeting was called to order at 6:07 p.m. at Maryann Lesnick's house.

Members present: Tom Taggart, Helen Gillikin, Billy Clay, Sally Peterson, Alec Winfrey, Maryann Lesnick, and Andy Mays

Excused: Gene Schmiel and Sandy Grillo,

Motion by Sally, seconded by Alec: to approve minutes of Sept. 2, 2025 Board of Directors meeting. Passed.

Pres. Report (Tom Taggart): The play, Radio Daze, was a great success. Thanks to all who were involved. Happy fall and happy Halloween! The club is busy now preparing for elections, the Variety Show, and the selection of a play for the spring performance.

V Pres. Report (Billy Clay): Billy thanked Tom for working to find candidates for the Board vacancies. Three (3) will be transitioning off the Board—Helen, Gene, and Billy. Three candidates have been identified so far, and each is willing to serve. Will also open it up for nominations from the floor at the November meeting.

The show was well received, and one individual gave an anonymous \$100 donation. Lots of folks are interested in how they can help. Also had a number of new Patrons.

Treasurer's Report (Helen Gillikin): Current balance is \$7,419.53. Deposits for ticket sales were about \$3,500 (we had 350+ paid attendees, and about 30 comps). Cost for the Cast Party was \$130. Total costs incurred for the show – about \$1000. Most of the cost was for printing – primarily the scripts and programs. Discussed the option of purchasing a printer and doing our own printing. Billy just got a new printer and volunteered to do our printing through the next show to see how it goes. Then we might consider buying a printer.

Activities (Sally Peterson): The program is ready for the October meeting. Paul White will guide us in teams through a series of "Bar Bet" games. Tom will do a reading, and it will be lots of fun!

Still working to select a spring show. Priscilla Knight has suggested Cinderella, but preparing the script will take a lot of time.

Membership (Alec Winfrey): A few new members found us as a result of the play. The most recent were Eric and Lisa Faret.

Alec will not be at the next General Membership meeting, but Sally has the nametags.

HHLT Board Meetings

Communications (Maryann Lesnick): Working on the newsletter. The website should be a focus next year. It needs a facelift and kept current.

At Large (Gene Schmiel – not present but sent report): The play was a financial and artistic success. The audiences were pleased, and so were the director, producer, and participants (cast and crew). It was also important for finding board candidates and on-stage new members, including one for LSTV! Kathryn and Gene will be returning the pipes and drapes to the shed (that area was being paved over the weekend), and they now have a load of costumes, hats, drapes, suitcases, tables, chairs, clothes, etc. in their basement. We need to be thinking about a new home for this stuff. Ideas?

Regarding the scholarship funding for high schools, Update: Andy Mays received an application template and the timeline/process for the PWC schools scholarship program. Two schools are targeted for scholarships now – Gainesville and Battlefield High Schools. It was noted that we should try to attend any performances put on by these schools this year!

Now that we have a new infusion of money from "Radio Daze," we can also identify additional recipients!

Gene sent an email to the cast and crew about giving away the poster from "Radio Daze."

Final item, we have several candidates for board positions – and our recent new members are likely candidates as well.

Old Business: Alec reported that he and Andy met with LSTV (Bobski) and settled the basic lighting, logistics, and general support requirements for the Variety Show.

Geri Lightburn is the Associate Producer and brought donuts for the meeting with LSTV (Dave always did that!). She and Alec are working to sync calendars for joint rehearsals with the presenters and LSTV to test and finalize things in November, and working with Patty to schedule them. CRC is sponsoring the show and will cover the printing costs.

New Business: We need a new poster person when Walt leaves. Walt may still be able to help from his new home after he moves, but if anyone is interested see Andy Mays.

The next meeting of the Board will be Tuesday, November 4. It will be held at Ands May's home, 13485 Victory Gallop Way at 6 p.m.

The next General Meeting will be at 4 p.m. in the Mountain View Room on Monday, Oct. 20.

Motion by Helen Gillikin, seconded by Sally Peterson: to adjourn the meeting at 7:24 p.m. Passed.




